PRESIDENT'S REPORT

- President Jones recognized his first 100-day milestone as President.
- Vice President of Advancement position has been posted, and there are 18 candidates to date.
- President Jones thanked Vice President Karl Spiecker for his work and leadership during
 his time with CWI. This is Vice President Spiecker's last Board of Trustees meeting. He
 has another job opportunity waiting for him in Colorado, which will allow him to be
 closer to his grandchildren.
- The search for a Vice President of Finance to replace Vice President Spiecker has begun, and there will be updates to the progress of the hiring committee in the near future.
- Commencement is coming up on May 13. President Jones relayed his excitement to get to celebrate with everyone and for his first CWI commencement.

BOLD ACHIEVEMENTS

- Executive Director, Audrey Eldridge reported on the Bold Achievements recognition highlighting the 2022 New Century Transfer Scholar, Karina McKay. Karina will receive a \$2,250 scholarship
- Congratulations to CWI Business Major, Ethan Williams and his Boise State teammate, Luke George for finishing first in the Services track of the Annual Idaho Entrepreneur Challenge. The two earned \$5,000 for their business, Lower Gear Cycles.

BOARD COMMITTEE REPORTS

a. College Relations

Communications & Marketing

- Executive Director, Audrey Eldridge reported summer and fall recruitment campaigns are fully launched.
- A direct mail marketing piece to over 100,000 households is being mailed this week.
- The branding transition is going well and is 90% complete.
- Mascot development process is 50% complete with excellent survey engagement from students.
- Vice Chair Buckner Webb asked what the reach is on the direct mail piece. Executive Director Eldridge stated it is a 10-County service area with households that include middle school and high school age students.

Government Relations

 Ashley Smith reported the Legislature wrapped up March 30, 2022. CWI received \$15 million dollars from the Permanent Building Fund. CWI will also receive 10% over last year in general funds.

Community Relations

 Lisa Grow, CEO of Idaho Power toured the Micron Education Center and CTE programs as well as Nampa Campus Academic Building (NCAB) where Dean, Kae Jensen gave a tour of a Chemistry Lab.

Provost Denise Aberle-Cannata shared about the Open Education Resources Collaboration.

- \$1,000,000 from Governor Little (\$250,000 for each Community College) to design and implement a Z-Degree (Zero textbook cost) program.
- CWI lead the charge on this project and Provost Cannata thanked the CWI
 Team; Justin Vance, Valerie Reed, Courtney Colby-Bond, Liza Long, all 3 Community
 College Provosts, Ryan Randall, TJ Bliss and Merlot Consulting.
- Special thanks to Greg Wilson who is the Project Manager and will be the CWI Liaison to Merlot Consulting.

CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT VISIONING & PLANNING FINAL RECOMMENDATION

- The Campus Development Visioning & Planning final recommendation was presented by Executive Vice President Craig Brown.
 - Chair Lenty appreciates the opportunity for this comprehensive process.
 - Trustee Reames stated as the valley continues to grow, by creating infrastructure today, this will provide dividends in the future.
 - Vice Chair Buckner-Webb likes the idea of the two campuses, which will help with the growth to the East and to the West.
 - Trustee Hightower thanked the entire Planning and Visioning Team for the way the information has been presented. The amount of feedback received from key constituencies in the broader community is so useful to decision making. Trustee Hightower is very grateful for all of the work that has been done and for being a part of this process.

SBOE STRATEGIC PLAN AND SPRING STUDENT SUCCESS MEASURES REPORT

- Alexis Malepeai, Executive Director Institutional Effectiveness reviewed the CWI Strategic Plan and Division of Financial Management (DFM) Strategic Plan
- Executive Director Malepeai reviewed the Spring Student Success Measures Report.
 - Chair Lenty asked Executive Director Malepeai what do these numbers tell us in your expert opinion. Executive Director Malepeai reviewed enrollment numbers with Dual Credit increasing by 3.6%, and Academic Affairs & Career Technical enrollment having declining numbers. CWI, being proactive, has enlisted the expertise of two outside consultants. Ferrilli, who is looking at the technology processes as well as Collegis looking at CWI's business processes. There is a lot of internal work going on around the student lifecycle, student success and retention.
 - President Jones added retention is one area of opportunity that could be identifying some of the numbers you are seeing. Other factors include a decline in enrollment across all institutions, impacts of COVID and employment markets could all play into these numbers. Many here at CWI are working diligently to rectify and see an increase in these numbers.

EMPLOYEE ENGAGEMENT SURVEY RESULTS

- Vice President Herring reviewed the Employee Engagement Survey Results. CWI engagement is strong and trending up.
- The next Employee Engagement Survey is scheduled for February 2024.

CHAIR REPORT

• Chair Lenty returned from the Chamber Leadership Conference over the weekend and there were many unsolicited positive comments made around President Jones and what has been accomplished in such a short amount of time. Chair Lenty is very appreciative and proud of the work being done.
