CONSENT AGENDA

(M/S) TRUSTEE HIGHTOWER/VICE CHAIR BUCKNER-WEB MOVED TO APPROVE THE CONSENT AGENDA AS PRESENTED. MOTION PASSED.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

- President Jones reported on JFAC's support of all line items CWI requested. As a college, we are very appreciative of our elected officials and their support.
- HB 24 Launch Grants; \$80 million was allocated for higher education last fall. This will
 enable High School Seniors to go on to some form of higher education. This includes
 post-secondary career technical training, allowing up to \$8,500 in grant money. The
 community college presidents have all communicated their support of the Governor's
 recommendation.
- On March 15, another CWI Steelheads night will happen. CWI will be promoting this Public Safety night with Police and Fire programs in the spotlight. Gov. Little will be there in support to drop the puck.
- President Jones has been connecting with city and county stakeholders by speaking at the Parma Lions club and meeting with the Caldwell and Meridian Mayors.
- President Jones also met with the Boise School District regarding the Whitewater Property.
- President Jones participated in a Workforce Panel for Deseret News, with Governor Brad Little, Lieutenant Governor Scott Bedke, and community leaders such as Tommy Alquist, Ball Ventures and Neil Nelson of ESI to name a few.
- On campus, President Jones met with the Honors Student group and the Student Advising and Success Team.
- Executive Director of Marketing and Communications, Audrey Eldridge presented this
 month's Bold Achievements highlight by recognizing CWI Faculty. Recently a number of
 faculty were honored during the 2023 Action Professional Development Day. 2023
 Innovation and Action winners were Janna McCurdy, Associate Professor of Psychology,
 Andrea Shoemaker, Department Chair of Agricultural Sciences. Casey O'Leary,
 Horticulture Instructor and Janel Holt, Associate Professor of Spanish. Additionally,
 Science and Math won the school wide innovation and action trophy.

COLLEGE RELATIONS

COMMUNICATIONS & MARKETING

Audrey Eldridge, Executive Director Marketing and Communications

- New Marketing Campaign will launch next week with a media mix of billboards, TV, radio and many digital ads. The budget this year will be split 40/60 with 40% going toward traditional and 60% to digital advertising.
- Number one Goal for this campaign; "Get the story right, to the right people, and at the right time." A very important component of this campaign is the evaluation

process, ensuring we measure impressions and engagements and drive awareness with the ultimate goal of increasing enrollment.

GOVERNMENT RELATIONS

- Vice Chair Buckner-Webb gave the invocation at former Gov. Phil Batt's funeral at the Capital.
- JFAC responded well to our budget line item requests last week, as President Jones had mentioned earlier.
- Excellence in Education Presentation to the House and Senate Ed Committees will take place on March 20, 2023.
- Continuing to talk with Educators about the value CWI delivers as well as updating them on the campus development projects.
- Continuing to track bills at the state house as the Legislature works hard to finish their legislative work.
- Trustee Reames asked if the Legislators have concerns regarding the North Idaho
 College situation and if any of their issues may affect CWI at some point. Director
 Smith stated President Jones spends a lot of time down at the capital to continue to
 educate Legislators on CWI's goal and mission and what we do every day at CWI to
 help students succeed.

FOUNDATION

Michael Jensen, Foundation Director

- Bank of Idaho presented a check in the amount of \$58,400 for the 2022 Swing For The Green Charity Golf Tournament benefiting CWI scholarships. Mark your calendars for the upcoming Swing for the Green event at Banbury Golf Course on September 21 & 22, 2023.
- Reminder March 15 is the final CWI Steelheads night (Public Safety night).
- April 12-13, 2023 will be the first ever CWI Giving Day. Trustees will be notified in the next couple of weeks how they can engage and support this event. The goal for this year's event is \$100K.
- Trustee Bradshaw thanked the Marketing Team as well as the Foundation Board and Staff for all of the great work they are doing.

STUDENT SUCCESS

Dean of Students, Chad Trisler

- Siempre Unidos and Dance Club are collaborating for lessons on hip-hop and a Hispanic Dance Workshop.
- Student Nurses Association Club is very community focused as well as helping to develop future nurses.

- Social Work Club and Queers & Allies Club came together to host a series of panel discussions.
- International Club works hard to connect the refugee and international students.
- Vice Chair Buckner-Webb commented how much she appreciates the way CWI approaches Student Success by looking at the wholeness of the student, not just their academic success.

POLICY

- Board Governance Policy 8
 - Trustee Hightower reviewed Governance Policy 8 (Measurement and Reporting).
 - There was a technical correction to the Purchasing Card Policy, but no substantive updates or changes to College Policy.

FINANCE - VICE PRESIDENT FINANCE, KEN KLINE

o The Monthly Treasurer's Report was reviewed.

PROVOST REPORT - PROVOST DENISE ABERLE-CANNATA

- Enrollment Update presented by Interim Assistant Vice President Enrollment and Student Services, Tyler Brown.
 - 2180 Credits added to the spring term; 4% boost to total credits taken this spring.
 - Over 600 students have registered for the 8-week courses, with 200 of those being new students who are not having to wait until fall to begin their CWI journey.
 - Entering an environment of "Registration is always open!"
 - Chair Lenty thanked AVP Brown for his enthusiasm, but also for what this means from an operational standpoint and for student accessibility.
 - Provost Aberle-Cannata announced the Occupational Therapy Assistant program
 which started two years ago, had their first accreditation site visit. They not only
 passed with flying colors, the team could not stop commending Mel Henderson and
 Angela Zaugg. Provost Aberle-Cannata stated she has never had an accreditation
 team member have to stop speaking because she was so overcome with emotion at
 the experience she had with our students, faculty and staff. This speaks to the
 commitment to program excellence here at CWI.
- Special Course Fees Fall Second Reading
 - Provost Aberle-Cannata reviewed one modification to the Special Course Fees. The cost for a background check went up, and work is being done to consolidate and centralize background checks by moving them to a program fee versus a course fee.
 - Trustee Hightower asked what the highlighted rows on the IncludEd fee schedules are.
 Provost Aberle-Cannata explained these are the line items from vendors and the bookstore, which are changing and fluid, and are out of CWI's control.
